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Hello. My name is Anne Dabrow Woods and I am the chief nurse of Wolters Kluwer and I want to take this time to wish each and every one of you a very happy nurse's week. Each year the American Nurses Association assigns a theme to each Nurses Week and this year is no different. The 2018 Nurses Week theme is nurses inspire, innovate, and influence.
